JOY OF GIVING

Did you ever wonder why we give gifts at Christmas? While it's a custom that's been around for centuries, perhaps we should remind ourselves why we do it.

The answer is simple. We give because God gave. At Christmas, we celebrate the gift of the Son of God to the world - a gift that came wrapped in swaddling clothes and was laid in a manger - a gift that forms the basis of our living.

And so we give, not only out of gratitude, but because that's who we are. If God is Giver, and we are made in His image, and redeemed to live as His people, giving is second nature for us (actually, it's a restoration of our 'first' nature, the one lost in the fall).

In fact, we are not who we are meant to be without giving. Giving allows us to express the joy we have in our hearts. It's like we can't help it. The blessings of God overflow in us, and spill over and flow freely to those around us.

A favorite Christmas hymn expresses it well: "Joy to the World." Indeed, there is joy in receiving the Gift, and there is joy in sharing the Gift.

There are those who say that giving is the barometer of the heart. Those whose hearts are filled with joy give generously and experience even more joy in giving. Those whose hearts are shriveled give grudgingly, and their hearts shrivel even more.

Remember the Grinch? In the beginning of the story, his heart was "two sizes too small", and his actions were consistent with his heart problem. He resented the joy the Who's of Whoville experienced. And at the end of the story, after he had seen how he had not stopped Christmas from coming, his "heart grew three sizes", and he shared all he had taken - and more.

There is Joy in the Gift, and Joy in the Giving.

FROM THE PASTOR

HILARIOUS

I own an Impala. I will never buy anything but an Impala again.

I grew up in Detroit, and was a Chevy guy. And then I wandered. I had to step out and test the world. And so I did. VW, Ford, Pontiac, Buick, Hyundai, Honda. I tried a lot of them, and some of them were good cars, but they all left me wanting.

Because at heart, I'm an Impala guy.

So 8 years ago, I came back. I traded in my Pontiac Gran Prix for an Impala. I went to a Chevy dealer and said, "I want an Impala." And two years ago, when it was time for a new car, I went to the same Chevy dealer, and said the same thing, "I want an Impala". And while nothing is certain, I would imagine that the next time I buy a car, I will go to the Chevy dealer and say, "I want an Impala." There is nothing to decide or debate. I will follow my heart.

That's what the passage means in 2 Corinthians 9:7, "God loves a cheerful giver." The Greek word defined as 'cheerful' is hilaros, from which we get the word hilarious. And the word means this – someone who's already inclined, someone whose heart is in it.

God loves those who give because their hearts are already in it. They don't have to be persuaded. They don't have to be shamed into giving. They've already given their hearts, and their wallets and pocketbooks simply follow along.

There are all kinds of reasons people use for why we should give – there are needs, it's a duty, it's right to share.

But there's only one kind of gift God loves, and that's a 'hilarious gift' - one in which the heart precedes the gift.

For me, the most 'hilarious' time in a worship service is when the offerings are gathered. That's when 'hilarious' givers are taking advantage of the opportunity to allow their wallets and pocketbooks to follow their hearts.

Interesting that 2 Corinthians does not say, "God loves a generous giver" or "God loves a big giver". He wants more than that. What he wants is hilarious – our hearts.

Years ago, my wife and I were hosting a Christmas party for the young adult Bible studies that we were leading. This was a gathering of all the Bible studies, and it was a typical evening of food, a silly gift exchange, and the good ol' Christmas cheer. During the party, there were some whispers about a woman in our group who was going through a divorce, and was really struggling with finances for herself and her son. Her immediate family lived far away, and her mom was in bad health as well, so we were a surrogate family in a sense. Somehow, in about 20 minutes, she was pulled to the side and given an envelope with about \$600.



Now I have no idea who contributed what money, or how twenty young adults could come up with that much cash on the spot. I hesitate to say it was a "miracle", but it was definitely impactful to her, and a big answer to prayer I'm certain. If I get to heaven and I find out Jesus threw in a couple 50 dollar bills, I will not be that surprised!

I wonder how often we imagine "giving" in the context of family. I find myself having to repent of looking through a lens of self-preservation with my resources, and instead praying that God helps me to look through the lens of his grace, and how important it is to find faith and peace in His Word, as well as the community of disciples He has blessed me with!

As a leader of the Bible study, I actually did not lead any of the initiative to help out a fellow "family member", nor did I contribute anything financially (they did it too quickly, I was too busy hosting!) I still felt great joy to even be in that house that evening and a part of that community. I think that part of existing as a proper family whether that be as biological or spiritual families, is that we let Jesus be the center of how we manage our resources, and we make sure we celebrate how good God is for being the hope we cling to!
